DEVELOP CRAFT

This month's Social Justice Art for Teens video is all about developing the studio habit of mind - DEVELOP CRAFT. That means you will learn about and explore a range of different art skills, concepts, tools and materials, develop your artistic craft and learn how to apply these to enhance particular aspects of your social justice art works. Developing Craft is inextricably linked to another studio habit of mind - Stretch and Explore - which is all about stepping outside of our comfort zone and trying new things.

Using Shading to Express Mood


Understanding and practicing different shading techniques can really enhance your drawings and art work. Shading can help give your drawings form, three-dimensionality and can also be used creatively to evoke mood and feeling, and communicate a message in your social justice art works.

DO THIS...

- 1. Explore the links on the page below, which will step you through a range of shading techniques.
- 2. Use the shading practice sheet below to practice the different shading techniques you learn.
- 3. Watch the video to look at some examples of artists who use different shading techniques to convey a particular mood and message.
- 4. Then, using the planning sheet, brainstorm a social justice issue and the mood you wish you convey from it, and create a drawing using your learned shading techniques to convey a mood or message about that social justice issue.

Making Your Own Clay & Sculpture

For this activity, you will explore how to make your own clay using household items and then use it to create a sculpture of a person that embodies a social justice art issue or is suffering from an injustice. Learning to stretch ourselves into 3D works can be a really great way to expand our art skills.

- 3. When your clay is ready, practice some of the sculpting techniques.

- 5. Look at the work of Choi Xooang to get inspiration for your sculpture.




Expressing a message in works of Social Justice Art doesn't always need to be in a realistic form. Abstract expressionism was a movement that sought to express emotional experience and as social justice artists, we know that emotional experiences are wrapped up deeply in social justice issues. Abstract Expressionist artists used a variety of different tools to create their art works. For this activity, you're going to make your own tools to help you express an emotional experience around a Social Justice issue.

DO THIS...

- 1. Take a look at the links on the following page, which includes videos and pages that will show you how to make your own painting and mark making tools.
- 2. Go on a scavenger hunt and find objects that you could use to make your own tools.
- 3. Get making!
- 4. Brush up on your Art history, and get inspired, by exploring the links about Abstract Expressionism and explore some key art works in the video.
- 5. Then, get ready to move ahead to the next activity, where you will make some home made paint and that you can use with your own mark making tools to create a work that expreses the emotional experience of a social justice issue.



Making your own paint.

We now have all of these amazing mark making and painting tools from the previous develop craft activity, as well as loads of inspiration from the Abstract Expressionists. Now what to do with all of that? Well, paint, of course! For this activity, you will be exploring a range of recipes that will have you making paint from household items. You will use this paint, together with the make making tools you created, to help you make paintings that express an emotional experience around a Social Justice issue.

DO THIS...

- 1. Explore the links on the next page, which include recipes and instructions on how to make paint from household items.
- 2. Choose some recipes to use and get paint making.
- 3. Use the template in the planning sheets to document your process with photos.
- 4. Hit pause and take some time to ruminate on a social justice issue of your choice. Use the mind mapping tool to document the kinds of emotions and mark making that would express the emotional experience of your social justice issue.
- 5. Create a painting, using your homemade paints and mark making/painting tools (created in previous activity) and create your own abstract expressionist painting.
- 6. Complete an artist statement that communicates your process and meaning.





Social Justice Stopmotion

Stop Motion animation can be a great skill to develop and a really interesting way to bring your social justice art works to life in different ways. For this activity, you will be developing your digital art craft and nosediving into the art of Stop Motion, storyboarding a social justice animation and hopefully bringing together all the skills you have learned thus far in this month's video.

DO THIS...

- 1. Watch the fantastic video tutorial on the next page, from Casula Powerhouse Arts Centre, which will step you through the basic requirements and skills of creating a Stop Motion animation.
- 2. Think about a social justice issue that you would like to create a stop motion about.
- 3. Think about what story you want to develop around this issue. Use the storyboard template in these planning pages to help you map out each frame of your Stop Motion.
- 4. Think about what materials you will use. This is a great opportunity to incorporate some of the skills you have learned in this video. For example, you might use your homemade clay to create some characters, or use your homemade paint and mark making tools to paint a background.
- 5. Take a look at the example from one of our young Social Justice artists to get inspired and get you creating!






